The Month in Brief

Consumer Price Index Number for Working Class

The Bombay, Sholapur and Nagpur Consumer Price Index Number for working class for the month of February 1974, with the average prices for the year ended December 1960 equal to 100 were 243, 282 and 275 respectively. The Jalgaon, Nanded, Poona and Aurangabad Consumer Price Index Numbers for working Class for the month of February 1974, with the average prices for the year ended December 1961 equal to 100 were, 282, 295, 256 and 279 respectively.

Industrial Disputes

During December 1973, there were 100 strikes involving 1,64,594 workmen and time loss of 5,20,882 working days, as compared to 102 disputes in November 1973 involving 26,561 workers and time loss of 2,46,695 working days. Further particulars of industrial disputes are given at page 1002 to 1011 of this issue.

Production of Cotton Yarn Spun and Manufacture of cloth

During October 1973, Mills in Bombay City produced a total of 1,52,75,000 Kgs. of yarn, 1,94,000 Kgs. of Miscellaneous goods such as, blankets, hosiery goods and knitted fabrics and packed 40,58,000 metres of cotton goods mixed with silk, wool, terene, etc. and packed 9,29,62,000 metres of wearable and non-wearable cloth and those in rest of Maharashtra produced 1,78,000 Kgs., of yarn, 98,000 Kgs. of miscellaneous goods such as blankets, hosiery and knitted fabrics 2,41,000 metres of cotton goods mixed with wool, terene etc. and packed 2,59,33,000 metres of wearable and non-wearable cloth. The total production of cotton yarn, miscellaneous goods and mixed goods with silk, wool, terene, etc. packing of wearable and non-wearable cloth for the whole State of Maharashtra amounted to 2,07,53,000 Kgs., 2,92,000 Kgs., 99,000 metres and 11,88,95,000 metres respectively.

Current Notes

Federation of Labour Co-operatives—Recommendation by Advisory Board

The National Advisory Board on Labour Co-operatives, which met at New Delhi on February 19, 1974 recommended the constitution of a National Federation of Labour co-operatives for giving Central direction and co-ordinating the activities of the labour co-operatives in the country. Shri A. P. Shinde, Union Minister of State for Agriculture, presided.

The Advisory Board urged that the various departments of Central and State Governments and public sector undertakings should adopt a positive policy to encourage labour co-operatives in their constructive activities.

The board also suggested that co-operatives should be financially assisted to have technical experts and engineers and that they should also be provided with requisite tools and machinery on concessional terms for undertaking specialised jobs. For this purpose, the board recommended that the State Governments should lay down necessary policy and budgetary and technical support to labour co-operatives.

Another important suggestion made by the Advisory Boards was that the Government should examine how far the scheme of concessional rate of interest charged by commercial banks, could be made applicable to labour co-operatives, which are the organisations of workers.

The Advisory Board emphasized that, as this programme of labour co-operatives was designed to protect the interests of workers, concerted efforts should be made to expand and strengthen this programme in the co-operative sector during the Fifth Plan. The objective should be a progressively increasing use of the services of labour co-operatives, specially in labour intensive work programmes.

There are over 7,300 labour contracts and forest labour co-operatives in the country with a total membership of nearly 6 lakhs. The value of civil and forest contracts taken up by them annually is of the order of Rs. 24 crores. State level federations of labour co-operatives have been organised in six States, as also in the Union Territory of Delhi.

Removing Poverty: Minister stresses Workers' Role

The First Annual Session of the Assam Agro-Industries SRAMIK Sangha, an affiliate of INTUC, was held at Gauhati on February 16 and 17, 1974. Meetings of the working committee and subjects Committee preceded the Session.

The open session was presided over by Shri Atul Chandra Saikia, M.L.A., General Secretary, INTUC Assam Branch.

Shri Hiteswar Saikia, Minister of State for Home and Education, Assam, while inaugurating the open Conference said that the State Government was taking steps to remove poverty and corruption through an economic revolution. To achieve this goal the workers had a vital role to play. Unless the workers come forward to play the role actively, the programme will not succeed."

Shri Saikia said that the employers or the managements in public sector industries should not try to run the industries to earn profit, at the cost of workers, whose legitimate demands should be met.

He complimented the INTUC leadership for correctly leading the working class of the State, Shri Jiten Dowerah, General Secretary of the Sangha presented his report.

Six resolutions were adopted by the conference demanding certain facilities from the managements.

Shri Saikia, in his presidential speech, traced the growth of Indian trade unions and their activities. He appealed to the workers in general to understand the problems which they are facing and to use their appropriate weapons in proper forum in a disciplined manner.

A symposium was also held on February 17, 1974 on "Social Security and Trade Union Movement" with special reference to Payment of Gratuity Act." Shri B. Hajaiki, Managing Director of the Assam Agro-Industries Development Corporation and Shri V. Sinha, Assistant Labour Commissioner, Government of India, took part in the seminar. Shri Uttam Baruah, presided over the symposium.

The Conference re-elected Shri Manabendra Nath Sarma, M.L.A., as President and Shri Jiten Dowerah as General Secretary unanimously. Shri Madan Sarma and Abjal Hussain were elected Vice-Presidents, Shri Jiten Bora, Shri Bhupen Baruah and Faijuddin Ahmed were elected Jt. Secretaries and Treasurer respectively.

Sugar Trade take over suggested by Panel

The Sugar Industry Commission has recommended nationalisation of the entire wholesale trade in sugar.

The 10 member commission is, however, equally divided on the question of take-over of sugar mills.

The final report of the commission was submitted by its chairman Shri V. Bhargava to the Union Agriculture Minister, Shri Fakhruddin Ali Ahmed at New Delhi on 27th February 1974.

The Commission set up in September 1970 had submitted an interim report last summer on the organisation of the sugar industry. In this report the question of nationalisation of the sugar industry was dealt with and the members were equally divided on the issue, with the chairman voting against nationalisation.

The final report reviews the progress and problems of the sugar industry in detail and recommends measures to ensure maximum production of sugar. It also discusses certain issues concerning organisation of the sugar industry which were not covered by the interim report.

Take-over of the wholesale trade in sugar is one such issue. At present under the policy of partial control over sugar trade, 70 per cent of the sugar production is taken over by the Government as levy for distribution through fair

price shops and the remaining 30 per cent is left with the mills for free marketing. The take-over of the entire wholesale trade would therefore mean a hundred percent levy.

For implementing the new policy, the Commission has recommended a National Sugar Corporation at the Central and several State-level sugar corporations.

Another recommendation made in the final report relates to the sharing of profits between the sugar mills and cane growers from recoveries in excess of 8.5 per cent. The Commission has also suggested long-term agreements between the sugar factories and the cane growers.

Bengal Engineering Units—Wage Hike Announced

The West Bengal Government in a notification, announced on February 22, 1974 that all categories of workmen in small engineering units employing 10 to 49 workmen would get an increase of Rs. 32 per month over the wages admissible under the Supreme Court decision. The total wages of an unskilled worker will now be Rs. 200, including the D.A. of Rs. 85 on 230 point of Consumer's Price Index. (Calcutta 1960=100).

An Appeal to Labour and Management

The Economic survey calls upon management and trade unions to do everything in their power to keep the wheels of production moving to meet the economic challenges the country has to face in 1974-75.

In a country with a considerable amount of unemployment, those in secure jobs are in the category of a very privileged class and they have to bear this fact in mind in asking for a larger size of the national cake, it says.

At the same time, there has to be equitable distribution of sacrifices and burdens to secure restraint or and discipline on the part of the working people. Wasteful, conspicuous consumption must be ruthlessly cut down, it adds.

Bonus move for labour equality with capital—W. Germany

The West German Cabinet on February 20, 1974 approved a bill intended to give workers an equal voice with shareholders in the running of all industrial concerns.

The Cabinet meeting under Chancellor Willy Brandt also approved the basic outlines of another bill to give wage and salary earners a share in the profits of industry.

The "Co-determination" law, to apply to companies employing more than 2,000 people, is to be presented to Parliament without delay. The Labour Minister, Mr. Walter Areedt, has told Parliament the Government would bring it into force by January 1, 1975.


Chancellor Brandt said the law putting worker-directors in the board rooms of big industry would "give labour effective equality with capital" to a greater extent than anywhere else in the world.

Francis Blanchard of France appointed ILO Director-General

The Governing Body of the International Labour Organisation at its meeting on 26th February 1974 appointed Mr. Francis Blanchard of France, Director-General, for a period of five years. The previous Director-General, Mr. Wilfred Jenks, died on 9 October, 1973. Mr. Blanchard was born in 1916.

A graduate of the School of Political Science and the Faculty of Law of the University of Paris, Mr. Blanchard had worked with the French Ministry of the Interior where he was in charge of matters concerning foreign Labour, refugees and displaced persons.

Mr. Blanchard joined the ILO in 1951 and has been Deputy Director General since 1968 with responsibility for technical co-operation and field activities. He was in charge of the build up of ILO's operational programmes in developing countries.

Notifications Under Labour Laws

Industrial Disputes Act, 1947

Government of Maharashtra has declared the Oxygen and Acetylene industry to be a public utility service for the purposes of the Act, for a further period of six months from 9th February 1974.

II

Government of Maharashtra has declared the Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation in the State of Maharashtra to be a public utility service for the purposes of the Act, for a further period of six months from 5th February 1974.

Bombay Relief Undertaking (Special Provision) Act, 1958

Government of Maharashtra has declared—

(a) that the said relief undertaking to which a loan has been provided by the State Government shall, for the said further period be conducted to serve as a measure of unemployment relief ; and

(b) directed that in relation to the said relief undertaking and in respect of the said further period for which the said relief undertaking continues as such —

(i) the said right, privilege, obligation, liability and remedy shall be suspended and the said proceedings shall be stayed ; and

(ii) the said provisions shall not apply and operation of the said awards shall be suspended.

Bombay Shops and Establishment Act, 1948

Government of Maharashtra have amended Notification, Industries and Labour Department, No. BSE. 1467/166258-Lab.-III-A, dated the 12th April 1973, as follows, namely :—

In the said notification, after the words " the provisions of this Act " the words " which apply to commercial establishments " shall be inserted.

Minimum Wages Act, 1948.

Government of Maharashtra has given notice of its intention to add to Part I of the schedule to the Act with effect from 1st day of June, 1974, the following Employment in respect of which it is of opinion that minimum rates of wages should be fixed under the Act, namely :—

“42. Employment in the establishment of an Advocate or Attorney of the High Court of Judicature at Bombay, in which five or more employees are employed, or were employed on any day of the preceding twelve months.”

Consumer Price Index Number for Working Class for February 1974

BOMBAY*

243— A rise of 2 points

In February 1974, the Consumer Price Index Number for Working Class (New Series) for the Bombay Centre with base : January to December 1960 equal to 100 was 243 being 2 points higher than that in the preceding month. The index relates to the standard of life ascertained during the year 1958-59 family living survey at the Bombay Centre.

The index number for the food group increased by 2 points to 272 due to a rise in the average prices of arhardal, gramdal, masurdal, groundnut oil, vanaspati (loose), goat-meat, fish fresh pampret, fish dry bombil, milk (pure), curd, chillies green, kalimiri, zeera and lavang.

The index number for the pan, supari tobacco etc. group increased by 7 points to 243 due to a rise in the average prices of pan leaf, supari, katha, cigarette and chewing tobacco.

The index number for the fuel and light group increased by 6 points to 250 due to a rise in the average prices of fire wood and charcoal.

The index number for housing remained constant at 120. The index number for the clothing bedding and footwear group increased by 1 point to 235 due to a rise in the average prices of saree, shirting, long c'oth, trouser's cloth, mulmul, bush shirt, vest, shoes, gents, and chappal-ladies.

The index number for the miscellaneous group increased by 1 point to 188 due to a rise in the average prices of medicine, news-paper, hair oil, blade, umbrella, durrie, utencils brass bucket, washing soap and tailoring charges of shirt and blouse.

In February 1974, the Consumer Price Index Number for Working Class (New Series) for the Sholapur Centre with base January to December 1966 equal to 100 was 282 being 11 points lower than that in the preceding month. The index relates to the standard of life ascertained during the year 1958-59 family living survey in Sholapur City.

The Index Number for the food group decreased by 18 points to 319 due to a fall in the average prices of rice, jowar, arhaldal, masurdal, groundnut oil, vanaspati, beef, sugar, gur and a fall in the sub-group index number of Vegetables and Fruits.

The index number for the pan, supari, tobacco, etc., group increased by 11 points to 204 due to a rise in the average prices of pan leaf, supari and katha.

The index number for the fuel and light group increased by 2 points to 222 due to a rise in the average price of firewood.

The index numbers for the clothing, bedding and footwear and the miscellaneous groups and housing remained stationary at 293, 195 and 153 respectively.

The index number for the pan, supari, tobacco etc., group increased by 4 points to 186 due to a rise in the average price of katha.

The index number for the fuel and light group increased by 3 points to 224 due to a rise in the average prices of fire wood, coke and coal.

The index number for the housing remained stationary at 148.

The index number for the clothing, bedding and footwear group increased by 12 points to 281 due to a rise in the average prices of dhoti, saree, trouser-cloth, bed sheet and chappal (gents).

The index number for the miscellaneous group increased by 4 points to 186 due to a rise in the average prices of hair oil, cinema charges, cot and trunk.

295—A rise of 4 points

In February 1974, the Consumer Price Index Number for Working class for the Nanded Centre with base year January to December 1961 equal to 100 was 295 being 4 points higher than that in the preceding month. The index relates to the Standard of life ascertained during the year 1958-59 family living survey at the Nanded Centre.

The index number for the food group increased by 2 points to 340 due to a rise in the average prices of rice, wheat, jowar, turdal, gramdal, masurdal, groundnut oil, fish (fresh), milk and banana.

The index number for the fuel and light group increased by 11 points to 261 due to a rise in the average price of kerosene oil.

The index number for housing remained stationary at 147.

The index number for clothing and footwear group increased by 15 points to 270 due to a rise in the prices of saree, long cloth, shoes and chappals.

The index number for the miscellaneous group increased by 6 points to 197 due to a rise in the average prices of the cigarettes (Golkonda charminar) and Utensils brass lota, poona, utensils aluminium bhagoona and toilet soap.

Although the number of disputes and number of workers affected due to strike in Maharashtra State during the month of December 1973 have increased/decreased as compared to the previous months, there was rise/fall in loss.

The figures for the month under review show 100 disputes in progress involving 1,64,594 workers and a time loss of 5,20,882 man-days as compared to 26,561 workers affected and time loss of 2,46,695 man-days in November 1973.

Of the total disputes in progress during December 1973 were in the Textile Industry, 21 in the Engineering Industry and the remaining were in other industries 59 of the total disputes involving 1,52,899 workers were recorded during the month while 41 disputes involving 11,675 workers were carried over from the previous month.

44 of the disputes arose over questions of "pay allowances and bonus" 47 related to "retrenchment and grievances about personnel" 5 on overtime and hours of works and the remaining 4 were due to other causes.

Of the 62 disputes that terminated during the course of the month 20 were settled either entirely or partially in favour of the workers 34 in favour of the employers, while the result of the remaining 8 disputes were indefinite.

The word "disputes" in the official sense means interruption of work and it is hereby used in the same sense as virtually synonymous with "strike". In compiling Statistics of the industrial disputes however, disputes in which 10 or more persons are involved are included.

MONTHLY PROGRESS REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF JANUARY, 1974

Employment Situation in General in Maharashtra State January—1974

The Employment Exchange statistics revealed a rise in the number of vacancies notified to the Employment Exchanges to the extent of a little over 300 in January, 1974 as compared to December, 1973. Placements, however, declined during the month as compared to the previous month.

Total vacancies notified by employers in the Public and Private Sectors rose to 7,084 in the month under review from 6,702 in the last month. The rise was observed in the Central Government and Private Sectors where notified vacancies rose to 875 and 3,063 respectively from 823 and 2,187 in December, 1973. Vacancies from State Government establishments decreased to 1,603 from 1,865 and those from Quasi Government establishments receded to 1,543 from 1,822.

During January, 1974 the Employment Exchanges succeeded in placing 3616 applicants in employment. This figure when compared with the placements of 4,503 in December, 1973 showed a fall of 887.

A sector wise break up of placements shows that there was a fall in all sectors except the Private Sector. Comparative statistics of placements are given below :—

A marked fall in placements is reported by Sub-Regional Employment Exchange, Thana—122 in January, 1974 as against 400 in December, 1973, District Employment Exchange, Alibag 48 as against 137, District Employment Exchange, Ahmednagar 73 as against 340, District Employment Exchange, Kolhapur 64 as against 131, District Employment Exchange, Nanded 68 as against 102, District Employment Exchange, Buldhana 23 as against 181, District Employment Exchange, Akola 143 as against 285 and District Employment Exchange, Bhandara 42 as against 180. None of these Employment Exchanges has given any reasons for the fall in placements which may presumably be due to non-receipt of results of submission.

Significant gains in placements have been reported by Sub-Regional Employment Exchange, Aurangabad and District Employment Exchange, Wardha. While the former placed 244 applicants in January 1974 as against 133 in

December 1973 the latter succeeded in placing 252 applicants during the month as compared to the last month. These employment Exchanges have attributed the rise in placements to the opportunities available to the applicants under the Special Employment Programme for the educated applicants.

Under the Special Employment Programme for the educated unemployed, the Employment Exchanges placed 8,959 applicants under the various schemes.

A concerted drive was launched by the officers of the Directorate of Employment in close collaboration with the officers of the Commissioner of Labour, Chief Inspectorate of factories etc. in January and February, 1974 to secure vacancies from the industrial establishments in the Bombay-Thana Region in order to fulfil the target under the scheme-training for upgradation of skill. As a result 2,464 vacancies were secured and the Employment Exchanges succeeded in placing 187 applicants for training so far. Some of these vacancies will be utilised for fresh S. S. Ss. for whom there are less openings in order to train them for floor level jobs.

Appreciation of Statistics renders.—(a) Registration—34,426 applicants were registered with Employment Exchanges in January, 1974 as against 39,304 in December, 1973.

Book - Review

INDUSTRIAL ADJUDICATION

(With special Reference to Reinstatement)

By Dr. R. S. Kulkarni, LL.M., Ph. D.

(Progressive Corporation Private Limited, Bombay, 1973. Price Rs.28-00)

The study by Dr. Kulkarni is limited to the law relating to the compulsory adjudication under the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947, with particular reference to reinstatement. The principle elements of industrial adjudication, its compulsive nature and its relative freedom for breaking new ground to meet new situations, are well brought out in the review of the experience of this system during the last two decades against the back-drop of developments in other countries like the U. K. and U.S.A.

After describing the provisions relating to adjudication machinery, its nature and scope, the theoretical postulates of reinstatement and the principles on which this relief is awarded, are very ably expounded.

The very fact that the University of Bombay has considered it fit to admit the author to the degree of Doctor of Philosophy for this work speaks volumes.

The book is invaluable not only to those interested in labour but also to sociologists and the general public.
